Friends of GVSU Greet Dr. Alaimo in Kraków

Taking a break from his Fulbright work at the University of Ostrava in Czechia, Professor Sal Alaimo visited Grand Valley's oldest international partner institution, the Kraków University of Economics (KUE), in Poland. The partnership with KUE goes back to 1975. Since 2005, about 25 KUE graduates have come to Grand Valley to earn a Master of Public Administration. While there, Dr. Alaimo met with one of our graduates, Kamil Makieła (MPA 10), who is now Associate Professor in KUE's Department of Econometrics and Operational Research, and also with Sylwia Rutkowska, who is Deputy Head of KUE's International Programmes Office.

GVSU Campus Safety Briefing

Here are some highlights from the GVSU Public Safety Briefing:

- Emergency Procedures Manual is in every department on campus
- Classroom Emergency Placard above the light switch in every classroom (includes the address of that classroom, severe weather shelter locations, where AED devices are located)
- Thumb turn lock on each classroom door to secure a classroom
- Lockdown button in the dispatch center will lock all exterior doors of a building, don't run out to manually lock these door
- Window decals on building entrances to direct first responders to appropriate entrance
- AED machines, 58 on campus, can request training for your department
- **Bleeding control kits**, blue bags that sit at the bottom of the AED boxes, include tourniquets, chest seals, packing wounds for significant injuries
- GVSU Alert, www.gvsu.edu/gvsualert to sign up, text, email, or voicemail
- Updated critical information, www.gvsu.edu/emergency
- **Desktop override**, when on the GVSU network an emergency alert will override your desktop, click acknowledge to return to your previous screen
- Laker Guardian app, to improve personal safety, panic button, safety timer, emergency phone numbers, text with GVPD, safety documents









CECI Demographics for Winter 2023
