Strategic Planning Oversight Task Force

The College of Education and Community Innovation will conduct a strategic plan exercise in the 2023-24 academic year. The Dean is creating a Strategic Planning Oversight Task Force (SPOTF) to lay the groundwork for this exercise. The work of this committee will include:

Identify strategic issues across the college and from the university (including alignment with RH2025 and SEMP) that must be addressed in the plan. (This would not exclude other issues from being added during the development of the strategic plan.)

Allocate strategic planning tasks among the existing CECI committees and units and, if needed, to-be-created taskforces.

Create a project management plan with appropriate timelines for completion of steps and products.

Inventory basic data availability and request important data that is missing.

Draft a recommendation to the Dean on the guiding principles of CECl's strategic planning process, including principles of collaboration, specificity, assessment, leadership, and transparency.

The SPOTF will work and meet regularly over the summer. Those appointed to the committee will receive a modest stipend for their effort. The SPOTF will present its work at the Fall College Kick-Off Meeting. The role of the SPOTF, if any, in the subsequent strategic planning process will be defined in the guidelines it develops. The commitment to serve on the task force does not extend beyond this summer.





Trends in course delivery modes, as well as percent of seats filled.


Ten-year Trend in Course Delivery Modes for **Lower-Division Sections** in CECI

(Lecture, Lecture/Discussion and Seminar Courses in CECI, COE, or CCPS)




Ten-year Trend in Course Delivery Modes for **Upper-Division Sections** in CECI

(Lecture, Lecture/Discussion and Seminar Courses in CECI, COE, or CCPS)




Ten-year Trend in Course Delivery Modes for **Graduate Sections** in CECI

(Lecture, Lecture/Discussion and Seminar Courses in CECI, COE, CCPS or SI)




Percent of Seats Filled in CECI **Undergraduate** Courses, by Prefix, 2022-23
