Dear Colleagues,

Leanne Kang, associate professor in the Literacy, Educational Foundations, and Technology (LEFT) department, in partnership with the Grand Rapids African American Museum & Archives and the Grand Rapids People's History Project, received a Community Collaboration Grant (\$11,000) from the GVSU Kutsche Office of Local History. With the grant, they will be putting together and hosting a series of workshops that will engage the community with historical research and counter storytelling, investigating Grand Rapids Public Schools' history after desegregation efforts in the 1960s and 1970s. Pearlette Merriweather, Public Administration (SCLD) alum, was <u>recently announced</u> as the interim city manager for the city of Muskegon Heights. The city manager is responsible for managing the department heads who oversee day-to-day operations of the city, including the police chief, fire chief, department of public works, inspections and planning. Previously, Merriweather worked for federal organizations such as the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission and USAID in the realms of contracts, grants and licensing.



Cathy Meyer-Looze, associate professor and unit head in Educational Leadership and Counseling (ELC), was recently selected to join the American Council on Education Women's Network Michigan (MI-ACE) <u>Senior-Level Leadership Job Shadow program</u>. This program provides mid-level women leaders who aspire to a senior-level position, the opportunity to gain impactful mentorship, learn from diverse institutional viewpoints and enhance professional knowledge and skills.



The **Groundswell Summer Institute 2025 (CEP)** took place August 5-7, and was a three-day immersive professional learning experience for local pK–12 educators from Kent and Ottawa Counties, focused on the fundamentals of place-based stewardship education (PBSE). Day one at GVSU's Seidman Building included grade-level breakout sessions with seasoned Groundswell teachers, exploration of best practices for teaching outdoors, and a community scan culminating in a visit to new local murals created through a partnership with <u>Pleasant Peninsula</u>. On day two at Riverside Park, participants learned about waterway stewardship, kayaked the Grand River to study its ecosystem, explored Anishinaabek cultural learning with the Grand Rapids Public Museum's Anishinaabe Curator, and began drafting outlines for potential PBSE projects and were given additional resources from Subject to Climate. The final day at Roselle Park in Ada involved planting seventeen trees, wading into a creek to study macroinvertebrates with Groundswell's partner LGROW, and discussing volunteer

training for PBSE field excursions. Each day of the workshop blended collaboration, expert insight, and practical activities to inspire future classroom stewardship projects. Teachers left energized, equipped with new resources and free materials, raffle prizes, and classroom funding opportunities—thanks to generous support from the Wege Foundation, Great Lakes Fishery Trust, MiSTEM, Michigan Sea Grant, and Subject to Climate.

• Eligibility:

- Faculty members (tenured, tenure-track, and non-tenure-track)
- Collaborations between faculty (internal and external to the College) and students are highly encouraged

Grant Use:

 Funding may be utilized for activities directly related to the development of a competitive proposal for external funding

Grant Exclusions:

 Funding cannot be used for standard operational expenses such as salaries, equipment purchases that are not directly related to the proposal development, or travel that is not specifically for proposal development

CECI Dean's Innovation Grant Application Deadlines: Monday, September 15, 2025 and Sunday, March 15, 2026.

Windows 11: Now is the Time to Upgrade! The upgrade rollout began for CECI back in May, but many have yet to complete. If you've been notified but haven't yet upgraded, please do so promptly to meet the deadline (October 15) and maintain optimal device performance. Visit the Windows 11@GVSU website for upgrade instructions and support resources. If you wait until the deadline and have an issue, there is no guarantee IT will have staff to assist, and you may find yourself without a working computer.

Notice: The Windows 11 upgrade requires <u>pre-upgrade preparation</u> and devoted time for the process. Estimated upgrade durations are below:

- Upgrade using wired internet connection on campus: 50 minutes
- Upgrade using wireless internet connection on campus: 1 hour
- Upgrade using **wired internet** connection **off-campus**: 2-4 hours (based on internet connection speed)
- Upgrade using wireless internet connection off-campus: 2-4 hours (based on internet connection speed)



Walk-up IT service support is available downtown in the L. William Seidman Center. Whether you need help with Wi-Fi, password resets, setting up software, or troubleshooting a device, the team is ready to assist.
