A possible change	Currently we have instructors assess 2-3 content and 2-5 skills SLOs. Since we now ask for all	Committee agreed
to how we ask	objectives to be assessed we have people assessing 10+ pieces of data each cycle. We can help	to split large class
units to assess	alleviate the work load and get better quality data by only collecting some of the data one year and the rest the following year. Director asked some instructors who all agreed they would rather do it all in one year. They did suggest allowing them to collect the data on 20-30 students as opposed to a full class of 40+. We could allow this if we had multiple sections being taught. Member feels like faculty may choose to assess their brightest students to inflate the results or because it is just easier to assess those students. Some members do not believe this would actually save time since they still have to assess the skills in 20-30 students so they might as well teach and assess them for all students. The QI states that we will think about a new way to assess large class sizes. We can survey faculty to get their feedback. Member believes that we need to fine-tune the assessment itself before trying to fix the frequency of data collection. Director stated that some instructors mentioned that we should walk away from reporting assessment ratings and just report how student performance changed over the duration of the course. We cannot walk away from the rating scores; however, we could add a question on the CAR asking instructors if they feel the assessment numbers are reflective of their opinion on how students learned the GE content and skills. Member stated that not all courses are offered every year, which could make it hard to gather	to split large class sizes but to leave the rest as is.
