Honors is not trying to change the category but members think they should have matching skills goals. Committee agreed to let the PCR go on to UCC, but resolved to work with Honors starting in fall to get a better handle on how their curriculum matches up with Gen Ed. In the short term, the GEC chair will ask Honors to state which skills goals correspond with the HNR 311, 312, and 313 courses.	
Log 9378: Course change – PHI 306, Wisdom of the East: Asian Philosophy [new to GEC, submitted 3/15/2016] To count for Cultures: World Perspectives. Skills are CCT and OC.	PHI 306 Member stated that under topics they shouldn't list discussions as optional because Oral Communications is a goal so it should be required. They also should not say "may include" to the first two topics listed as they are required to teach the content of the course. In Oral Communication, how will the instructor teach evidence of rehearsal as the proposer only stated that students would be given class time to practice. Member stated that it was probably done that way so feedback could be given on their rehearsal. Proposal does state peer reviews will be done. Amendment: SoR regarding optional topics that should not be optional.	M. Velez Ortiz moved to ask for amendment. P. Thorpe 2 nd . Motion carries 11-0. Amended proposal to be returned to chair.
Log 9334: New course – ARA/MES 330, Aladdin on Trial: Arab Identity in Literature & Culture [new to GEC, submitted 3/22/2016] To count for Issues: Identity.	ARA/MES 330 Member was confused on the title and finds it potentially offensive. The CCC called attention to the title but it was not addressed. There is no explanation for teaching other than for teamwork. Member stated that the explanation for Problem Solving objective 2 is very vague. SoR methods of evaluation lists oral presentations and research paper without explicitly identifying them as outcomes of the group project. Member stated that we should make mention of the committees concern for the title and how it is perceived. Amendment: Identify methods of evaluation in SoR as either group or individual. Ask for a better explanation of the instructor's role for teaching all three skills goals. Explain/give an example for objective 2 under Problem Solving. Chair will email UCC about concern with title just to ensure it isn't overlooked.	M. Velez Ortiz moved to ask for amendment. P. Thorpe 2 nd . Motion carries 11-0. Amended proposal to be returned to the GEC.
