

PAS Program Student Clinical Year Corrective Intervention and Remediation Policy and Procedure

Students identified by the PAS program as having deficiencies in knowledge and/or skills during the clinical year of the program may be offered [corrective intervention](#) and/or [remediation](#).

1. Students who receive a below 80.00% score for an assessment item on the Preceptor Evaluation of the Student Form are required to complete corrective intervention. Corrective intervention is done individually according to the nature of the deficiency. Corrective intervention may include additional assignments or additional clinical time. This may delay program completion.
2. Students who do not successfully complete all the skills on *the Clinical and Technical Skills Checklist* are required to complete corrective intervention. Corrective intervention is done individually according to the nature of the deficiency. This may delay program completion.
3. Students who do not successfully complete a clinical year assignment during the clinical year are required to complete corrective intervention. Corrective intervention is done on an individual basis, and the student is required to complete the assignment at a satisfactory level before program completion. This may delay program completion.
4. Students who fail a clinical rotation may be given the opportunity to remediate the rotation by means of an [independent study](#). Remediation may be actual clinical time or independent study, depending on the nature of the deficiency. Independent study may include assignments such as topic readings, outlines, and quizzes. This may delay program completion.
 - a. Students who fail a clinical rotation due to the preceptor evaluation score are allowed ONE opportunity to remediate for up to TWO clinical rotations.
 - b. Students who fail more than TWO clinical rotations due to the preceptor evaluation score are dismissed from the program.
 - c. Students who fail a clinical rotation because they do not pass the [retest](#) for an end-of-rotation exam or do not qualify for retesting (as outlined in [PAS Program Student Clinical Year Retesting Policy and Procedure](#)) are given ONE opportunity to remediate each clinical rotation. Students who fail the remediation for a clinical rotation are dismissed from the program.
 - d. Students who fail a clinical rotation undergo academic review as outlined in the [PAS Program Student Policy for Academic Review](#).
5. Students who do not achieve minimum academic standards for a clinical course (PAS 610, 620, 630) may be given the opportunity to remediate, depending on the reasons for the course failure. Decisions regarding the availability of a remediation plan are determined on a case-by-case basis review as outlined in the [PAS Program Student Policy for Academic Review](#).
6. Students who do not achieve minimum academic standards on one or more summative assessments are required to complete corrective intervention as outlined in the respective course syllabus. All students are required to demonstrate competency on all summative assessments prior to program completion. This may delay program completion.
7. Grades for corrective interventions and remediation efforts during the clinical year are assigned as outlined in the course syllabi for Clinical Rotations I-III (PAS 610, 620, 630) and independent study courses (PAS 699), as applicable.
