PAS Program Student Tutoring Policy and Procedure Policy

PAS program students at academic risk are offered peer tutoring services using the following procedure:

- 1. The College of Health Professions (CHP) provides funds for tutoring for PAS students at academic risk during the didactic phase of the program.
- 2. The PAS Department Chair (DC), PAS Program Director (PD), and the PAS Traverse City Assistant DC identify potential tutors who:
 - a. Have successfully completed the course they are applying to tutor.
 - b. Are in good academic standing.
 - c. Are effective communicators.
 - d. Are willing to provide a minimum of three hours of structured tutoring per week for the remainder of the semester.
- 3. Tutors meeting the above criteria are hired through CHP Dean's office.
- 4. Hired student tutors complete FERPA training and are given access to Blackboard course(s) by the Instructor of Record.
- 5. Students who are at academic risk are identified if they:
 - a. Score below 65.00% on one non-PAS course examination or <70.00% on one PAS course examination.
 - b. Score below 75.00% for a non-PAS course examination or <80.00% for a PAS course examination on two or more occasions in one course.
 - c. Do not meet academic standards for a PAS program course at the end of a semester.
 - d. Are identified by their PAS program academic advisor.
- 6. Students at academic risk are offered tutoring services by the PAS DC, PAS PD, or the PAS Traverse City Assistant DC based on tutor availability.
- 7. The PAS student tutors and students at academic risk determine a mutually agreeable time to meet for a minimum of three hours each week.
- 8. Student tutors provide a summary of the tutoring sessions after the semester to PAS Department Chair (DC), PAS Program Director (PD), and the PAS Traverse City Assistant DC.
- 9. PAS students who receive tutoring receive a brief survey to provide feedback on the tutoring process after the tutoring period to PAS Department Chair (DC), PAS Program Director (PD), and the PAS Traverse City Assistant DC.
- 10. The PAS DC, PAS PD, or the PAS Traverse City Assistant DC determine if changes to the tutoring program are necessary for subsequent semesters.

Definitions:

Good Academic Standing: A student in good standing in the PAS program, is one who has maintained an overall graduate GPA of >3.0 and does not meet the criteria for academic review as outlined in the PAS Program Student Policy and Procedure for Academic Review and the GVSU Graduate School Academic Review Policy.
