PAS Student Policy and Procedure for Disciplinary and Professionalism Review

- 1. All PAS students are expected to adhere to all university, college, and program policies and maintain professional standards in all interactions.
- 2. All PAS students are expected to adhere to the Student Code (https://www.gvsu.edu/policies/category.htm?categoryId=2D0C8EF7-9959-9B01-959C403E725313F3#Section%205.0%20-%20Student/UAO%20Expectations).
- 3. Students who violate these policies, procedures, or Student Code will be referred to the PAS Program Student Academic Life (SAL) committee for disciplinary and professionalism review. The SAL committee will consult with the PAS Program Director (PD) and/or the PAS Department Chair (DC) as needed. The SAL committee, in conjunction with the PAS PD and/or DC, shall take one of the following actions:
 - a. Disciplinary warning (student notified in writing)
 - b. Disciplinary probation (continuation with conditions). The length of the probation will be based on the nature of the violation.
 - c. Program Dismissal
- 4. A PAS student may be dismissed from the PAS program for violation of the PAS Program Criminal Background Screening Policy.
- 5. A PAS student **shall** be dismissed from the PAS program under any one of the following conditions:
 - a. Evidence of unethical or illegal behavior.
 - b. Students requiring disciplinary probation more than once.
 - c. Students who meet the criteria for disciplinary probation and are currently on academic probation.
- 6. The PAS program will notify PAS students of any disciplinary action taken within sixty (60) days of the PAS Program Student Academic Life (SAL) committee, PAS Program Director, or PAS Department Chair's notification of the event.
 - a. Students requiring probation more than once.

Definitions:

Probation: Probation is a status that can be assigned to students who have had academic (academic probation) or professional/behavioral problems (disciplinary probation) as outlined in the PAS Program Student Policy and Procedure for Academic Review and the PAS Program Student Policy and Procedure for Disciplinary and Professionalism Review. The duration of the probationary status will be determined by the student's academic progress or professional/behavioral problems, but will extend, at a minimum, to the end of the following semester. When a student is placed on probation, the PAS Program Director and/or Department Chair, in conjunction with the SAL Committee, will draw up a contract that outlines the steps to be followed to be taken off probation. The contract will be signed by the student and the PAS Program Director and/or Department Chair. During the period of probation, the PAS faculty advisor will monitor the student's progress, but the student is ultimately responsible for the completion of the terms of the remediation plan.
