Visa Guidelines - CHILE

The information below provides general guidelines regarding the visa application process and required documents. This information can change frequently and students should always refer to the Consulate of Chile's website for the most up to date application procedures, required documents, and visa fees.

Permanent residents of Michigan will be required to work through the Consulate of Chile in Chicago. If you are a permanent resident of another state, you must research which Consulate has jurisdiction over your home state.

Please look over the visa information carefully and do not delay, as visa procedures can be complicated and subject to change.

Additional Information	All applicants should plan well in advance to secure an FBI background check which is
	required for a student visa. The FBI background check can take anywhere from 3-16
	weeks, depending on the backlog of requests. The FBI background check must be
	current (issued within 4 months) when you apply for your student visa. The timing of
	this process will be important to make sure you apply for the FBI background check in
	plenty of time, but not too early that it will expire before you are ready to apply for
	your student visa. You must apply for your study visa within 90 days prior to your
	departure.
	Alternative to applying directly to the FBI for background check:
	Past students have been able to expedite the process of securing the FBI background
	check by utilizing the <u>Fieldprint Services Team</u> for an extra fee (currently \$50). This
	service can provide a background check within 24 hrs of your appointment.
	All applicants will be required to appear in person at the consulate to receive a visa.
