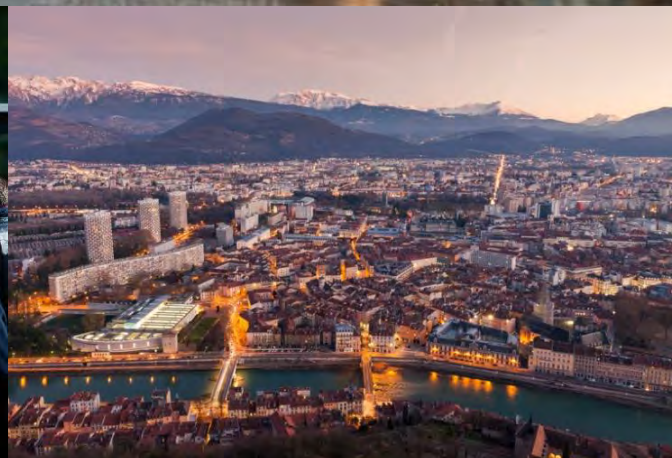

Grenoble Ecole de Management



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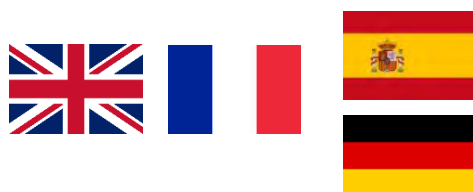
Grenoble Ecole de Management welcomes around **300** exchange students per year coming from 34 different countries from all over the world.

Application Procedure and Deadlines

- All applicants must enroll online following the enrollment link that will be sent directly to the student by the Center for International Affairs.

Online application	<p>From April 1st: First semester/academic year enrolments</p> <p>From September 1st: Second semester enrolments</p>
Deadlines Online application & Required documents	<p>May 1st First semester/academic year enrolments</p> <p>October 1st Second semester enrolments</p>
Required Documents	<p>The full list of documents to provide per program is detailed further down on our fact sheet.</p> <p>Documents need to be submitted either in English or in French. Please pay special attention to the language prerequisites as well as to other prerequisites (credits, modules, etc.) that may apply to each program.</p>
Sending the required documents	<p>All documents need to be uploaded on our online application. Students are required to upload their latest official transcript of records & diploma (if applicable) on the online application.</p>
Double degree (where such bilateral agreement exists)	<p>Only Master 2 students may apply.</p> <p>A set curriculum is to be taken.</p> <p>Beware: Students need to join late August for a full academic year & are requested to participate in the intensive French seminar unless they can justify a B2 or an equivalent level in French.</p>

Course requirement	<p>A semester is composed of 30 ECTS an academic year of 60 ECTS. Students joining the Bachelor 2nd year & 3rd year programs must follow all modules including the French language module (FLE). In other exchange programs, students could be allowed to follow less ECTS (with previous authorization of home university) but no fewer than 25 ECTS.</p> <p>This is not applicable for double degree students. (Mandatory set curriculum)</p>
French as a Foreign Language (FLE)	<p>All our English exchange programs include a “French as Foreign Language” (FLE) module. A test will be run upon arrival to set up the group levels.</p>

- International students will be contacted by the **GEM International Student Integration “ISI” Service from May onwards** (first semester/academic year enrolments) or **from November onwards** (second semester enrolments).
 - Students will be contacted by the **GEM “ISI” Service** with the information necessary to organize their accommodation and other administrative formalities. This will include access to the school housing platform.
 - To ensure that students receive all the latest information from the GEM ISI Service, **they need to add contact@powow.grenoble-em.com mail to their email contact preferences and check their spam inbox.**

Important:

- Reserving housing independently without the guidance of GEM ISI Service may lead to an unsatisfactory experience. Our help aims to ensure that students find safe and suitable accommodation for their student lifestyle.
- Once accommodation is reserved through the school housing platform, students will be able to request a housing certificate necessary for the visa application. GEM cannot provide you with this certificate as the School does not have its own student residence or dormitory.

Visa applications can take up to 3 months, students need to start this process as soon as possible. We recommend students to consult the official French [visa wizard](#) to help them identify whether they require a student visa and know to which consulate they should submit their application. It is also advisable to contact your local [Campus France](#) agency for guidance in the visa application process.

Students with a disability benefit from special arrangements and personalised support to facilitate their education and professional integration. To this end, a file must be filled out and submitted to the dedicated service upon entering GEM.

**(if coming for a full academic year exchange and if a bilateral double degree agreement exists)*

120 ECTS minimum required from which **90 ECTS** need to be **business related** if coming for an academic year and **60 ECTS** if coming for a semester.

Undergraduate Programs

Bachelor level

Documents Required

- CV (in English)
- Certified copies of transcripts
- Certified copies of diploma (if available)
- 3 presentation documents in English (motivation for the program, your intercultural experience, your extracurricular activities) – **to be filled directly by student while enrolling online**
- 2 professional / academic references : either 2 academic references or one academic and one professional related
- 1 passport-size photo (for student ID)
- Proof of English competence (one of the following):
 - **Native speaker**
 - **TOEFL:** Internet (IBT): min. 90 overall (with a minimum of 21 in all subscores - Reading, Speaking, Listening, Writing)
 - **IELTS:** min 6.5 with a minimum of 6.0 in all bands (Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking)
 - **Cambridge English** (Proficiency, Advanced, Business Higher) **level C1:** Grade: A, B, C
 - **Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE - A)** min. 63 (min. score of 59 in each section)
 - **Duolingo:** 110 (min. of 90 in all bands)

English program:

Certificate in Global Management (English track I)

Program equivalent to a Bachelor 3rd year level

This is the first year of the classic 3 year **French Grande Ecole** Management program **taught in English**.

French program:

French Grande Ecole Program (Year I)

Program equivalent to a Bachelor 3rd year level

This program is solely composed of core courses in both semesters.

Trilingual program:

Trilingual program (Year I)

Program taught in English (50%), French (25%), and German or Spanish (25%)

This program simultaneously combines the acquisition of 2 Modern languages and the fundamentals of business management.

- Proof of English competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent)

French programs:

- Proof of French competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent)

Trilingual Programs

- Proof of English, French and Spanish or German competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent)

English programs:

Graduate Certificate in Global Management (English track 2)

This is the second year of the classic 3 year **French Grande Ecole** program taught in English.

French program:

French Grande Ecole Program (Year 2)

Both semesters of the program are composed of elective and core courses.



Graduate Programs Master I level

(motivation for the program written in French if following a French program)

English programs:

- Proof of English competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent)

French programs:

- Proof of French competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent)

English programs:

Master in Management (English track 3)

French program:

French Grande Ecole Program (Year 3)

Both programs have a specialization semester (elective courses) in the first semester. A student can choose to follow either 5 or 6 modules. The second semester is composed of core courses.

Master 2 programs can be joined on a regular semester/academic year exchange or on a double degree scheme*

where bilateral double degree agreement exists between Grenoble Ecole de Management and the partner institution.

DOUBLE DEGREE STUDENTS

The first day of attendance will be the first day of the French seminar: **August 23 2022**

Students who are enrolled on a “double degree” need to join us late August for a full academic year & need to participate in the intensive French seminar unless they can justify B2 or equivalent level in French.

The seminar consists of 30 hours of intensive French classes, which will be followed by 70 more hours over the academic year. This is planned in order to secure the French exam which is part of the final exam.

Students must have completed their Bachelor degree and must present a copy of their diploma (translated either in English or French) at the time of applying.



Graduate Programs Master 2 level

Documents Required

- CV (in English)
- Certified copies of transcripts
- Certified copies of Bachelor degree
- 1 presentation document in English
(*motivation for the program written in French if following a French program*)
- 1 passport-size photo (for student ID)

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

English programs:

Proof of English competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent when following a regular exchange)

French programs:

- Proof of French competence except for native speakers (level B2 or equivalent)

DOUBLE DEGREE STUDENTS

- Proof of English competence except for native speakers:
TOEFL: Internet min. 85 overall (Listening, Reading, Speaking min 20 and 22 for Writing)
or IELTS min 6.5 score is required (min 6.0 per band)
(Please refer to double degree agreement)

- Copy of Bachelor degree is required

Please note applications must be placed very early, e.g. Eiffel grant: applications are received once a year in Nov/Dec of the year prior to the academic exchange.
