Touré is well-known for his social commentary. He is a former NBC contributor and former MSNBC co-host of “The Cycle.” A contributing editor to “Rolling Stone” and other publications, he is the author of several books, including “Who’s Afraid of Post-Blackness? What It Means to Be Black Now.”

Patrisse Cullors is a Los Angeles-based social activist who, with two other people, started the movement #BlackLivesMatter in 2013. As the truth and reinvestment campaign director for the Ella Baker Center for Human Rights, Cullors works to build the response capacity of communities that are affected by violence.
