Police Cadet: We hope you continue to promote this position with your students as it is a great opportunity to have a part-time job while in school. If anyone has questions feel free to direct them to me but here is a brief overview of the position! **THIS IS NOT A SUMMER INTERNSHIP BUT A PAID PART-TIME YEAR ROUND POSITION!** Students employed by use can use this for internship credit hours with permission from their advisor.

Minimum Training and Experience

This position requires the following basic requirements:

- Must be enrolled as a student in a college or university of good standing and be at least 18 years age.
- A minimum of 9 credit hours shall be sustained per semester (excluding summers)
- Maintain a GPA of 2.0
- Possess a valid Michigan driver's license
- No history of felony convictions or convictions that prohibit ownership, possession, or control of a firearm.
- The ability to read and understand departmental policies, rules, regulations, police literature, the ability to write clear and accurate reports, basic computer skills, and the desire to be part of an organization that values service, people, integrity, responsibility, innovation, and teamwork.

Other Necessary Qualifications

- Possess good moral character as determined by a favorable comprehensive background investigation covering school and employment record, personal traits, and integrity. (Arrests and expunged convictions, all previous law violations, and personal protection orders.) A poor driving record or misdemeanor convictions may negatively affect opportunity for employment.
- This position will be disqualified upon completion of an Under Graduate Degree or Master's Degree or failure to maintain current college enrollment.
- There is no requirement to major in Criminal Justice, all majors will be considered for this position. This position requires a minimum of an 18-hour work week and a maximum of a 24-hour work week.

RICHFIELD TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT

(IN GENESEE COUNTY)

Richfield Township Police Department (in Genesee County) is accepting resumes and applications for a full-time police officer position. Resumes and applications are being accepted from anyone who has, or will have, completed an MCOLES Certified Academy or those willing to attend a Certified Academy.

- ❖ Those candidates still needing to complete an MCOLES Certified Academy can receive sponsorship from Richfield Township Police Department, if chosen and upon completion of a background investigation and MCOLES written exam and physical agility test. Sponsorship will include:
 - Complete payment of academy tuition, uniforms, and academic supplies,
 - Paid wage of \$23.92/Hr, while attending the academy (16 weeks @ 40 hours/week)

Those candidates who wish to join our police department can expect the following:

- ❖ Excellent individual/family benefits for medical, optical and dental to include medical upon retirement for the employee and their spouse
- ❖ April 1, 2025, starting pay to begin at \$26.88/hour, and after 1 year increases to \$28.78/hour
- ❖ Contracted pay increases every year for the first 5 years, then at 10, 15 and 20 years
- ❖ Prior police experience can receive up to a 5-year rate, with Employer approval (5-year rate as of April 1, 2025 is \$33.00/hour)
- ❖ Up to 208 hours of vacation time with an additional 40 hours of personal time per year
- ❖ Reimbursement for college courses, with the approval of the board of trustees and if courses are taken while employed by Richfield Township Police Department
- ❖ Education benefits for pay equal to 2% additional base pay for any officer having a Bachelor's degree and 4% additional base pay for any officer having a Master's degree
- ❖ 3% Shift Premium for any shift starting after 12:00 PM (noon)
- ❖ Opportunity for specialized instructorships within the department such as: Firearms, Defensive Tactics, First Aid, Davison Area Reconstruction Team (DART crash team)
- ❖ 13 Paid Holidays per year to include the employee's birthday
- ❖ Pension through MERS being a Hybrid plan of a MERS Defined Benefit Plan with a 1.5 multiplier and a 401(a) Defined Contribution Plan with the Township contributing 7%
- ❖ MERS Vesting at 6 years – 55/25 Retirement (Age 55 with 25 years of service) – FAC 5
- ❖ POLC Union membership
- ❖ Employer paid \$50,000.00 Life Insurance Policy
- ❖ 12 Hour Shifts (generally working 7 out of 14 days, with a 3-day weekend every other week)
- ❖ Non-offensive tattoos allowed & beards allowed up to a half inch in length
- ❖ 36 square mile rural township with a community that is very supportive of the Police Department

Mutual Learning in Prison Education

AUP is offering a special course on prison education to undergraduate students interested in law, social work, social psychology, and education, as well as all those from various disciplines who are interested in civic engagement, dialogue, and justice. This innovative class brings AUP students into a shared educational and creative space with people detained at La Santé prison in Paris. After introductory classes at AUP, AUP students will spend the semester sharing readings, discussions, and creative activities with detainees. In each class session at the prison, AUP participants ("outside students") and people detained at La Santé ("inside students") participate in ice breakers and read short texts in English and French together as a group. This class emerges from a collaboration between AUP and the cultural activities department of the Centre Pénitentiaire Paris La Santé, a newly renovated remand prison in the 14th district of Paris. Detained participants, who primarily speak French (but also other languages), will learn alongside AUP participants, who primarily speak English (but also other languages). A creative, inclusive, and experimental multilingual environment is maintained in the classroom.

AUP students can participate with a low-intermediate conversational French level (B1 or higher). Interested students will need to complete a secondary application for faculty approval in addition to the application for AUP Summer School.
