COMPENSATION (AS OF 7/01/2025):

- Starting Recruit pay: \$25.89/hour
- Starting Officer pay: \$34.27/hour (\$71,273 annual)
- Officer pay after 5 years: \$43.74/hour (\$90,966 annual)

BENEFITS:

- Overtime: Paid at 1.5x or may be converted to compensatory time off
- Retirement: 401(a) with 22% total contribution (12% employer, 10% employee)
- Insurance: Comprehensive medical, vision, dental & life, Retirement Health Savings Account
- Vacation & Holidays:
 - 80 vacation hours after 6 months, up to 160 hours accrued annually
 - o 11 paid holidays annually
 - 24 hours of personal time accrued annually
