GRADUATION VS. COMMENCEMENT

- ► Graduation: The accomplishment when you have successfully completed your degree requirements and your degree is awarded by the Registrar's Office.
- ► Commencement: The ceremony to celebrate graduation.

GRADUATION APPLICATION

Application Process:

- Before you apply, **look at myPath** to make sure you are meeting your degree requirements
- Apply to graduate through myBanner
 - Apply for the semester in which you will finish your degree requirements, NOT when you want to walk at the Commencement ceremony.
 - We recommend applying the semester before you intend to graduate.

After you apply:

Once you apply, you will receive emails from the Registrar's Office to notify you about the status of your degree audit

After your degree is awarded:

- It will take approx. 6-8 weeks for your diploma to arrive after your degree is awarded.
 - Does the address on your graduation application reflect where you will be residing after graduation?
 - Email <u>audit@gvsu.edu</u>, if you need to update your address.


