 representative to fill our Seidman vacancy.
 - 2. I also want to share a very exciting initiative that connects directly to the campus vibrancy challenge President Mantella has asked all of us to support. Student Senate, in partnership with Event Services from the Office of Student Life, has launched a new pilot program we're calling the SPARK Fund—Student Programming and Recreation at Kirkhof. Here's how it works: starting this weekend, RSOs hosting Friday, Saturday, or Sunday events can apply directly through Event Services for up to \$500 in support. On top of that, after successfully hosting their event, they'll also receive a

\$75 food credit for their next meeting. This is a revitalization and reimagination of a program the Kirkhof Center once ran, and the hope is that through this pilot, the University will see the appeal and ultimately take over funding long-term. If you're involved in an organization—or know students who are—please spread the word. The more successful this pilot is, the stronger the case for making it permanent.

- 3. As for tonight's meeting: after we process our funding requests, we'll be breaking into mixed teams made up of new senators, returning senators, and members from each committee. Each team will be tasked with answering three questions. You'll have 30 minutes to collaborate, think creatively, and put ideas on paper. Afterwards, we'll come back together to share the best answers and insights. I'm really looking forward to seeing what you come up with.
- 4. Outside of that, not too many other updates—I will be meeting with Colleen Bailey next week if anyone would like to join me. And of course, don't forget about our two big events coming up: our Student Solutions Summit and our Open House next week. Both are critical opportunities to show students who we are and what we do.

- a. Black Student Union Aux Wars

ii. Group Two:

- More-involved welcome week. Make the welcome week longer, some students arrive on campus earlier and can attend more events. Evolving gen-ed courses, making these more guided towards a student's major.
- Bussing routes wanted towards Allendale. Also, providing another dining hall option. Higher pay for student wages and stricter regulations on quality control. Adding more bike and scooter lanes.
