- a. President Evan Jackson

Two years ago, the Student Senate underwent restructuring, and last year we concluded the restructuring and achieved a monumental year as we made the final touches. Now, that chapter is closed. There is no more rebuilding to be done. The foundation has been laid. It's time to tip our cap to the student leaders who came before us—and run with it. They did their work; now it is time for us to do ours. This year, there are no excuses for not getting the work done. And what is that work? We will further Senate's reputation as the "go-to" problem solvers and doers on this campus. - vi. Later in the fall, in November, we will pause for an internal check-in—a chance to take stock of how we're operating as an organization, reflect on leadership, and assess where we can improve. And to close out our semester of impact, we will meet with Laker Food Co. to identify areas for improvement and ensure student needs around dining and food access are being addressed.

So here's my call to action: your service matters. Your presence here is not symbolic—it represents over 20,000 students who depend on us to be their voice. If you are here, be *all in*.
