High-quality advising and mentoring supports timely degree completion, student success, and graduate students' professional/workforce readiness.

Key Roles

Graduate Program Directors:

- Organize program orientations, assign advisors, and/or serve as program advisor
- Provide guidance on course planning and program requirements
- Monitor and support graduate students' academic progress

Graduate Faculty Advisors:

- Help graduate students develop program plan
- Support graduate students' scholarly and professional development
- Offer regular feedback and career guidance

Thesis/Dissertation Committee Chair and Members:

- Support graduate students' research development
- Evaluate proposals and final defenses
- Provide timely, critical feedback to support graduate student research

Project Supervisors:

- Guide students in planning, developing, and completing academically rigorous and relevant end of program projects
- Provide clear expectations, regular feedback, and support throughout the project
- Promote professional skills, ethical standards, and opportunities for graduate students' project dissemination

Graduate Students:

- Communicate regularly with advisor and program faculty and staff members
- Monitor academic success and advocate for professional learning and growth
- Understand and follow university policies
