Continuing Education Scholarship Program Process

1) Verify Eligibility

Eligible Applicants:

- Must be employed full-time at a GVSU-authorized charter school
- Must meet GVSU graduate program eligibility requirements

Financial Support:

- 50% of GVSU tuition for individuals with less than five years of continuous employment at a GVSU-authorized charter school
- 80% of GVSU tuition for individuals with five or more years of continuous employment at a GVSU-authorized charter school

Credit Limit:

- Scholarships are limited to 12 credits per person per academic year (Fall through Spring/Summer semesters).

Application Requirement:

- Applicants must complete the scholarship application before each semester.

Funding Availability:

- Scholarships are subject to the availability of funds and are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis to applicants who complete all requirements.

4) Register for Course(s)

5) Complete Scholarship Program Application

If you meet eligibility requirements, scholarship funds will be applied to your GVSU Student Account by the [tuition deadline](#) set by the university.

If you are *not* eligible for scholarship funds, you will be notified within two weeks of submitting your scholarship application.

6) Pay Remaining Tuition and Fees

You are responsible for paying, or setting up a payment plan for the tuition and fees not covered by your scholarship funds.

7) Successfully Complete Course(s)

If you drop or fail a course after receiving scholarship funds, your Student Account will be billed for the amount awarded, and you will be responsible for paying the balance.

8) Maintain Employment

If you do not maintain employment at a GVSU-authorized charter school during the semester for which you receive scholarship funds, your Student Account could be billed for the amount awarded, and you could be responsible for paying the balance.
