The competitive admission process admits 48 students into the fall semester, 48 students into the winter semester, and 48 students into the summer semester. *Detailed application and admission requirements are available online at www.gvsu.edu/kcon*

- **GVSU Undergraduate Application:** Students must be admitted as degree-seeking undergraduate students for the semester in which they intend to begin the professional nursing program.
- The first bachelor's degree must be earned and verified prior to the first day of the professional nursing program.
- **Declare** Nursing major prior to secondary application submission.
- **Minimum Overall 2.70 GPA** is required (including non-GVSU college courses).
- **Minimum Prerequisite 2.70 GPA** is required (including non-GVSU college courses).
- **Minimum grade of "C"** (not C-) or higher is required in all prerequisite coursework.
- **Adhere to KCON Repeat Policy:** Student is allowed to repeat three admission prerequisite courses (only two of the three can be science courses, BMS, CHM, BIO). A course cannot be repeated more than once.

- **Complete an Application** August 1-8 for admission into the winter semester (January) or January 1-8 for admission into the summer semester (May) or May 1-8 for admission into the fall semester (August).
- **Transcripts:** Official and updated copies of ALL non-GVSU transcripts sent directly to the GVSU Admissions Office

Selected students must submit documentation of the following: physical examination, verification of immunizations, TB testing, CPR certification, drug screening and a criminal background check.

Admission Considerations

Admission to the nursing program is highly competitive. Students who only meet minimum requirements may not be admitted. Admission is based on balanced consideration given to the following components:

- Academic grade point average from prerequisite courses (*BIO 355, BMS 212, BMS 250, BMS 251, CHM 234, PSY 364*)
- Interview
- Personal Statement
- Student Profile

Nursing Program Progression Policies

To progress in the B.S.N. program, a minimum grade of C (2.0) is required in the prerequisite, required, corequisite, and all nursing courses.

A grade less than a C (2.0) is considered a failure in all required B.S.N. courses. Students who fail more than one required course will not be allowed to remain in the program. Withdrawal from a course when "not in good standing" will be considered a course failure regardless of when the withdrawal occurs.
