¹Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should normally take this course in the winter semester of their first year.

Students will not need to take WRT 120/130 or WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

²MTH 131 and PHI 103 do not require MTH 110. If you change your major to something that requires any other math courses, you will need MTH 110. You can take the math placement test, see an advisor for specific details/recommendations

Guide for Declaring the PK-12 Education Majors and Minor

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major."
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "German Teaching-BA-PK-12 Education."
5. Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your 2nd major in "Education" and give you the option to declare a minor. Choose an appropriate minor from the list and then click "Change to New Program."

Study Abroad: German majors interested in teacher certification are required to study abroad for at least one semester (12-15 credits at the 300-level) in a German-language study abroad program. Program must be approved prior to study abroad by an advisor from the German Department and can be used to fulfill major requirement courses. For students who are unable to complete this requirement due to familial, financial, or other concerns, alternatives do exist. <u>Meet with a German advisor as soon as possible to discuss your coursework and plan study abroad.</u>
