Because teacher candidates in German need to meet the state requirement of at least Advanced-Low in oral proficiency through an official Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) before admission to the College of Education, German minors interested in teacher certification are required to study abroad for at least one semester (12-15 credits at the 300-level) in a German-language study abroad program. Program must be approved prior to study abroad by an advisor from the German Department and can be used to fulfill minor requirement courses. For students who are unable to complete this requirement due to familial, financial, or other concerns, alternatives do exist. Meet with a German advisor as soon as possible to discuss your coursework and plan study abroad.
