

Due to the physical location of the Academy, students have the unique opportunity to engage in real-life implementation and experiences of the fine, performing and visual arts through our Flint Cultural Center campus partners.

CSO Capacity Analysis

Flint Cultural Center Academy (FCCA) continues to demonstrate sound academic, fiscal, and organizational capacity. Located on the grounds of the Flint Cultural Center, the academy augments its academic program with unique experiences for students to engage in learning. Now entering its sixth year of operation, the school is expanding to grade 9. Since opening, FCCA has slightly outperformed its identified peer schools. Strong school leadership coupled with a stable teaching staff provides the Charter Schools Office (CSO) with confidence in the academy. Organizationally, the school board works well with the CEO to provide comprehensive leadership and direction. The academy has managed its fiscal resources well, providing a successful academic program while growing a substantial fund balance in preparation for the addition of the high school. In total, the CSO has confidence in Flint Cultural Center Academy's capacity to improve its educational program while moving forward with its plans.










Student Resident Districts
