

CSO Capacity Analysis

Legacy Charter Academy's charter contract was set to expire on June 30, 2024, resulting in the academy going through the renewal process during the 23-24 academic year. During the renewal visit, the Charter Schools Office (CSO) observed that the academy continues to demonstrate fiscal and organizational stability. Academic performance is improving compared to statistically similar schools. As a result, the academy was awarded a five-year charter contract renewal. Additionally, the CSO has observed that the academy board is long-standing with strong leadership in every role; are aligned in the mission and vision of the school, and they are dedicated to the success of the academy. Academy leadership is strong and intentionally cultivating a culturally diverse and positive environment. Enrollment has also remained steady. This evidence provides the CSO with confidence the academy has the capacity to strengthen its academic program and remain a quality educational option for families in the community it serves.


Educational Goals






