Academy Description

Reach Charter Academy, located in Roseville, Michigan, opened its doors in the fall of 2008. The school serves students from many neighboring school districts. These districts include, but are not limited to: Roseville, East Detroit, Detroit, Warren, Harper Woods, Saint Clair Shores, Grosse Pointe, Frasier, and Sterling Heights. During the 2023-2024 academic year, Reach enrolled 578 scholars from these communities.



CSO Capacity Analysis

The Reach Charter Academy continues to exercise organizational and fiscal soundness. The academy board and school leadership are aligned on and remain faithful to the mission of the academy. The educational service provider hired a principal, teaching staff, and administrative deans to increase the academy's capacity in evaluating data, engaging in continuous improvement, and identifying appropriate interventions to improve student achievement. The academy's character development curriculum supports teachers in their knowledge and skill development while building a support system for social and emotional learners. The Charter Schools Office (CSO) is confident in the academy's capacity to deliver quality academic programming while maintaining a strong school culture during the subsequent term of the charter contract.


Educational Goals







Student Resident Districts


Subgroup Enrollment and Attendance
