CSO Capacity Analysis



Academically, the school continues to struggle to meet its educational goals as stated in the charter contract. To alleviate the challenges in achievement on standardized testing, more emphasis has been placed on student academic growth. School leadership, the academy board, and the educational service provider support each other in the acquisition of materials and systems aimed at improving student academic outcomes. The academy continues to struggle with compliance deadlines. Fiscally, the school ended the year with a balanced budget. Overall, the Charter Schools Office has observed the academy's effort to improve the educational outcomes of students.


Educational Goals








Student Resident Districts
