

UNIVERSITY REPORT ON PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY AUTHORIZING

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REPORT INTRODUCTION

This University Report on Public School Academy Authorizing (Report) fulfills requirements contained within Michigan Public Act 15 of 2025 (PA 15), Section 275k. The requirements specify that each public university that receives an appropriation under Section 236 that, in the current or previous academic year, serves or has served as an authorizing body shall submit a report to the House and Senate appropriations subcommittees on higher education, the House and Senate fiscal agencies, the state budget director, and the Michigan Department of Education no later than December 1 of each year. The law identifies minimum requirements for the information that must be contained within the report.

Grand Valley State University (GVSU) is a state public university whose governing Board of Trustees serves as a charter authorizing body as that term is defined in MCL 380.501. As such, GVSU receives an appropriation under Section 236. This Report contains all legally required information as well as additional information pertinent to GVSU's authorizing practices and the public school academies it charters.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

GVSU has authorized public school academies since 1995 and is proud to support Michigan students, families, and educators through high-quality K-12 options. The University strives to be the model university authorizer by strategically connecting learners, education practitioners, and community members to create equitable educational pathways, strengthen educational outcomes, inspire innovation, and foster lifelong achievement.

GVSU's public school academies serve a diverse array of inner-city, metropolitan, rural, and virtual communities. At the time of this Report's submission, GVSU authorizes 78 public school academies that operate pursuant to a charter contract between GVSU and the Board of Directors at each school. The GVSU Board of Trustees appoints the public officials who serve on each school's Board of Directors. There are 298 individual board members appointed across the 58 boards that oversee the public school academies within GVSU's portfolio.

In total, as of the fall 2025 Preliminary Headcount, public school academies authorized by GVSU enrolled 33,773 students. Of those students served, approximately 81% identify as students of color, 73% are economically disadvantaged, and 11% receive special education services and support. The total number of fees, reimbursements, contributions, or charges permitted under section 502(6) that were collected or retained by GVSU for oversight operations in the most recent fiscal year (FY 2025) was \$10,012,085.

In addition to the legislative obligations of an authorizer, GVSU is proud to provide a range of comprehensive support and services to the schools it authorizes to improve teaching and learning.

SECTION C: SCHOOL PROFILES

Section C includes an alphabetized list of the public school academies currently authorized by GVSU. A profile for each school on this list includes the following information in fulfillment of section 275k(1):

(a)(i) The year in which the school was authorized.

For this report, "the year in which the school was authorized" is defined as the initial charter contract start date. This date is included in each school's profile.

(a)(ii) The location of each school.

The location of each school is listed in the school profile.

(a)(iii) The owner of the property at which each school is located, and the physical buildings utilized by the school, as applicable.

The owner of the school site and physical building is located in the school profile.

(d) The academic performance of each school currently authorized, including whether a school is identified by the Department of Education as a partnership school.

The academic performance and partnership status of each school is included in the school profile. Academic data pertaining to the performance of all public school academies is included in MI School Data (www.mischooldata.org), Michigan's official source for pre-K, K-12, postsecondary and workforce

data. These data are used annually by GVSU to determine how well each school is meeting the educational goals included in Schedule 7-1 of the charter contract. For most GVSU-authorized schools, those goals are:

<u>Academic Achievement</u>: As measured by the state assessment, the school's percentage of total tested students in all tested grades identified as proficient in all tested subjects or identified as college ready as reported by the Michigan Department of Education will meet or exceed the select peer schools' mean reported percentage of total tested students in all tested grades identified as proficient in all tested subjects or identified as college ready.

<u>Academic Growth</u>: As measured by the state assessment, the school's mean student growth percentile rank in English language arts and math will meet or exceed the select peer schools' mean student growth percentile rank.

Select peer schools are the set of school buildings determined annually by GVSU to be the most demographically, socioeconomically, programmatically, and geographically like the authorized school.

The academic data in each school profile is from the 2023-2024 school year, which represents the most recent academic year where all relevant data has been available and synthesized. At the time of this report's drafting, the Michigan Department of Education had yet to release student growth data from the 2024-2025 academic year, which is used to determine how well an academy is meeting its academic goals.

Appendix D and Appendix E provide detailed explanations of each data field in the academic performance section of the school profiles including information for schools that use alternative education goals.

(e) The total enrollment of each school at the time of submission, the grades served, and student turnover rate compared to the previous academic year, as applicable.

The total enrollment, grades served, and student turnover rate compared to the previous year is included in each school's profile. Note that "enrollment" is the preliminary fall 2025 pupil membership count submitted to GVSU, and "student turnover rate" is defined by calculating the percent change between the 2024 pupil membership count required by MCL 388.1606 and the total enrollment of each school at the time of submission. A positive student turnover rate indicates an overall net gain in student enrollment. A negative turnover rate means an overall net loss in total student enrollment. Special circumstances that significantly affected enrollment, such as a building reconfiguration or grade reduction/expansion, are noted in each school's profile, as appropriate.

(f) Aggregated student enrollment data for students with an individualized education program as well as the total amount of special education cost reimbursements received by each school during the school's most recently completed fiscal year.

Each school profile includes the total amount of special education reimbursements received by the school's district through state aid during the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Special education reimbursements include the total amount received via the Special Education Headlee Obligation (51(c)) and the Special Education Foundation Allowance (51(a)). Each profile also includes the number of students enrolled in

2024-2025 with an individualized education program (IEP).

(g) The total number of fees, reimbursements, contributions, or charges permitted under section 502(6) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502, that are assigned to each school currently authorized in a single academic year.

Each school's profile includes the total number of fees, reimbursements, contributions, or charges permissible under section 502(6). That section permits the university to charge an oversight fee of up to 3% of the total state aid that each public school academy receives. GVSU's practice, however, is to charge a 3% oversight fee on the foundation allowance only and exclude categorical funds for at-risk students and students with disabilities. This practice brings the effective rate of the university's oversight fee to approximately 2.6% of state aid, or 13% less than the maximum amount permitted under applicable law.

(h) The names of the members of the board of directors of each school currently authorized and the date that each member of each board was appointed.

Each school profile lists the current Board of Directors with first name, last name, role, initial appointment date, and the end date for their current term.

(i) The name of the applicant who applied and received approval to organize each currently authorized school.

Each school profile includes the first and last name of the public school academy charter applicant.

(j) The list of contracts and length of their terms, with education service providers associated with each school currently authorized pursuant to section 502 of the revised school code, 1976 16 PA 451, MCL 380.502, as applicable. The contracts described in this subdivision include but are not limited to, those described in section 502(2)(d) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502.

Each school profile includes each school's contracts and length of contract terms. The contracts listed in each school's profile provide a service to the school as defined in MCL 380.503c(2)(c), in that they provide educational, administrative, management, and/or instructional services or staff.

SECTION D: SCHOOLS IDENTIFIED AS PARTNERSHIP SCHOOLS

Section D fulfills requirements of 275k(1)(d) by detailing any school that was identified as a partnership school and including a description of corrective actions in the school's partnership agreement, the duration of the agreement, and an assessment of progress toward improvement.

SECTION E: SCHOOL CLOSURES AND LOSS OF AUTHORIZATION

Section E fulfills the requirements of 275k(1)(b) by providing a list and description of GVSU public school academies that closed permanently and/or lost their authorization from GVSU during or directly following the 2024-2025 academic year, or at any point during the 2025-2026 academic year leading up

to the date of this report's submission.

SECTION F: SUCCESSOR CONTRACTS IN BOTTOM 5%

Section F fulfills the requirements of 275k(1)(c) by providing a description of any new contracts for operation of a public school academy that will operate as the successor to a public school academy that is currently being operated under a contract issued by another authorizing body that is currently performing in the bottom 5% of schools. GVSU does not approve applications from existing public school academies that are in the bottom 5%.

Core Authorizing Responsibilities & Activities [MCL Sec. 275k(1)(h), (k), and (l)]

CORE AUTHORIZING RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACTIVITIES

As an authorizing body, GVSU is responsible for overseeing the public school academies within its purview. A core function of this role is to ensure strict adherence to legislation related to public governing entities, including the Open Meetings Act (OMA), Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), and laws prohibiting conflicts of interest. These legal mandates serve as cornerstones for fostering transparency, protecting the public interest, and maintaining the trust of community stakeholders.

To meet this responsibility effectively, GVSU and the governing boards of each public school academy authorized by the University collectively uphold the principles of open governance and access to information, as well as the identification and elimination of conflicts of interest. Additionally, GVSU has diligently implemented a series of proactive compliance measures that are applied across all boards of directors. These efforts are rooted in accountability and require each academy to uphold integrity throughout all academic, operational, and financial practices.

Board Member Selection

Schedule 1 of the charter contract provides details around the method of selection and appointment of academy board members. GVSU is required to vet every candidate who applies to be appointed or reappointed to the board of directors for a GVSU-authorized public school academy.

To be qualified to serve on an academy board, a person shall (a) be a citizen of the United States; (b) reside in the State of Michigan; (c) submit all materials requested by the GVSU Charter Schools Office including, but not limited to, a GVSU Academy Board Member Questionnaire and a release for a criminal history background check; (d) not be an employee of the Academy; (e) not be a director, officer or employee of a company or other entity that contracts with the Academy; and (f) not be an employee or representative of GVSU or be a member of the GVSU Board of Trustees.

Individuals who are interested in serving on a public school academy board or directors must first be nominated as a board candidate to GVSU. All candidates then fill out an initial application through the GVSU Charter Schools Office. The application asks the candidate to certify their status in relation to the citizenship, residency, employment, and public office requirements listed in the previous paragraph. They are also asked to provide consent for a criminal background check.

All candidates are also required to submit disclosure forms and undergo an interview designed to unveil potential conflicts, encompassing family and business relationships with vendors. Identified conflicts undergo thorough investigation, and a final determination is conducted by GVSU's Office of General Counsel. Applicants with unresolved conflicts are not endorsed for consideration to the GVSU Board of Trustees.

Candidates who successfully complete all application materials, background checks, and interviews are then recommended for final review and approval by University Counsel and the GVSU Board of Trustees. Appointments to the board are then made by action from the GVSU Board of Trustees during public meetings.

Following appointment by the GVSU Board of Trustees, the candidate may begin their legal governance duties, including the right to vote, after they have signed an Acceptance of Public Office form and taken

the Oath or Affirmation of Public Office administered by a member of the academy's board, other public official, or notary public.

The appointment process is prescribed further in the Method of Selection within the charter contract.

Key Authorizing Activities & Oversight

GVSU also embraces a culture of continuous improvement among the public school academies it authorizes and within its own authorizing work. The university's policies and procedures have been peer reviewed by the Michigan Council of Charter School Authorizers (2020), verified through an Assurance and Verification review conducted by the MDE's Public School Academies Unit (2020), and accredited by Cognia (2020).

The list below provides an overview of GVSU's commitment to responsible governance and the key activities undertaken by the university to meet the functions of an authorizing body under Section 502.

ADHERING TO THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT: GVSU employs a comprehensive strategy to ensure
the compliance of each board governing our public school academies with the Opens Meeting
Act (OMA). The foundation of this approach lies in the Method of Selection outlined in GVSU's
charter contract. This section delineates the specific characteristics and procedures that boards
must adhere to when conducting official business.

To further ensure strong governance, GVSU conducts board member training focused on parliamentary procedure, the OMA, and effective governance practices. This targeted training enhances each board member's capacity to govern.

Additionally, GVSU reviews and requires the submission of all public notices, meeting agendas, and meeting minutes for examination prior to each meeting. This ensures adherence to regulatory standards and transparency in all board proceedings.

GVSU goes further by assigning a dedicated staff member to each public school academy board. These staff attend all board meetings and monitor board activity. Their role includes ensuring required quorums are met, compliance with closed session regulations, and effective onboarding and training of board members. Throughout the year, staff provide training to assist board members in meeting GVSU's expectation for strong public governance.

• **ELIMINATING BOARD MEMBER CONFLICTS OF INTEREST:** GVSU's commitment to transparency and ethical governance is most evident in the charter contract, which explicitly prohibits conflicts of interest among all board members overseeing GVSU's public school academies. Prior to the appointment of any board member, GVSU conducts a rigorous evaluation process. Each applicant is required to submit disclosure forms and undergo an interview designed to unveil potential conflicts, encompassing any family and business relationships with vendors.

This responsibility doesn't end with an appointment. All board members complete an annual conflict of interest form, outlining any direct or potential conflicts. If a conflict is identified, a

careful assessment is conducted to determine necessary steps for resolution, which may include board member resignation or removal. Moreover, school board members are expected to promptly update their conflict-of-interest declaration should any potential conflict arise during their term, ensuring an ongoing commitment to ethical governance.

- **ENSURING FOIA COMPLIANCE:** Each GVSU public school academy is required to appoint a FOIA coordinator, per the charter contract. This position provides prompt and appropriate responses to all relevant requests.
- ASSESSING CHARTER APPLICANT FEASIBILITY: GVSU employs a rigorous, multi-phase process to
 assess every public school academy charter applicant. Applicants address elements outlined in
 Section 502(3) (a-i), accompanied by a compelling description of evidence of how they will serve
 the community through innovative or proven best practices. Consistent with GVSU's
 commitment to innovation and excellence, the evaluation process considers many factors,
 including, but not limited to, applicant history, proposed education goals, conflicts of interest,
 the student population to be served, and thorough site and facility evaluations.
- **FULFILLING FIDUCIARY DUTIES**: GVSU is the fiscal agent responsible for the prudent disbursement and tracking of state aid funds on behalf of its public school academies. The university is also responsible for monitoring any intercept agreements between the academies and the Michigan Department of Treasury. GVSU employs rigorous ongoing compliance monitoring and financial reporting processes, regular audits, and internal control systems to ensure responsible stewardship of public funds.
- CONDUCTING A COMPREHENSIVE CHARTER CONTRACT RENEWAL REVIEW: As GVSU public school academies near the end of their charter contract term, GVSU initiates a thorough and comprehensive review, scrutinizing the academic, fiscal, and operational performance throughout the contract's duration. This meticulous analysis is a collaborative effort with independent experts in school operations, ensuring validation and confirmation of the adherence to appropriate terms. Prioritizing transparency, the process maintains a straightforward approach, with the primary goal of assessing the school's capability to fulfill its promised mission and vision effectively.
- COLLECTING STATUTORY REPORTING DOCUMENTS: GVSU annually collects and reviews
 approximately 5,000 legally mandated documents, as outlined in the charter contract's Master
 Calendar of Reporting Requirements. To manage this process with precision, these documents
 are collected via Epicenter, a digital compliance tool. Document submissions include budgets,
 financial statements, audits, board meeting minutes and postings, school handbooks and
 policies, and school insurance policies.
- PROVIDING ANNUAL PERFORMANCE REPORTS: GVSU annually publishes performance reports
 about its public school academies to demonstrate how well they are meeting their charter
 contract goals. The reports use state assessment data to evaluate academic performance, along
 with cyclical financial statements and compliance submissions to provide an enhanced

perspective of the academy's overall viability.

ISSUING CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: If an academy is experiencing a significant gap regarding
academic, fiscal, or organizational performance, GVSU may send the academy a notice of noncompliance with the expectation of rapid adjustments. Academies that receive a notice are
required to submit a detailed plan of correction for GVSU to closely monitor. Lack of
improvements may ultimately result in non-renewal of the academy's charter contract.

Aside from fulfilling the duties required of a charter authorizer, GVSU has historically distinguished itself by going beyond the requirements of Section 502 as the university strives to build an innovative public education system to enhance student achievement.

This dedication to learners is furthered by the GVSU CSO through its work to hold GVSU's public school academies to high standards and high possibilities. It is emphasized through the collaboration that occurs across additional university departments to provide a robust variety of assistance and resources. The close relationships between GVSU and the public school academies it charters provide a supportive space that cultivates transparency, trust, and a unified exploration for better solutions.

Below you will find some of the additional activities that GVSU engages in to proactively empower K-12 students and educators to seize upon more opportunities for improvement and sustained academic success. Ultimately, they also contribute to statewide goals of creating an enhanced college-going culture, strengthening the teacher pipeline, and preparing Michigan learners of all generations for the workforce of the future.

- EDUCATOR SCHOLARSHIPS: GVSU offers tuition assistance to certified educators employed at
 GVSU's public school academies who want to participate in relevant graduate degree programs
 offered by the GVSU College of Education and Community Innovation. GVSU also offers financial
 support to undergraduate student interns who choose to complete their clinical experience
 requirements in a GVSU-authorized public school academy.
- COLLEGE PATHWAY PROGRAMMING AND SUPPORT: GVSU annually provides its public school
 academies with numerous on-campus programs to complement classroom learning and show
 students that college can be their reality. The university has also created unique scholarships
 and programming for any undergraduate student enrolled at GVSU who also graduated from a
 charter public high school authorized by GVSU. Charter alumni enrolled at GVSU receive
 additional assistance and programming to help them successfully advance in their studies and
 career preparation.
- RESEARCH INITIATIVES: GVSU is deeply committed to advancing the field of education through
 an extensive research agenda. This agenda is conducted in coordination with the public school
 academies GVSU charters as well as other higher education institutions that also authorize
 schools. Research endeavors have focused on topics like innovative classroom instruction,
 curriculum development, student assessments, teacher training methods, and best practices for
 authorizers. Findings are used to inform the development of evidence-based practices and

contribute valuable insights to GVSU's public school academies and the broader educational community. Recent reports can be found at www.gvsu.edu/cso/research.

In summary, GVSU is proactive as a public school academy authorizer, as demonstrated by the university's thorough commitment to transparency, compliance, and responsible governance. It reflects a dedication to serving the best interests of students, communities, and all stakeholders involved in the educational process. Furthermore, the efforts to uplift students and educators, build a seamless educational journey, and expand access to higher education underscore GVSU's unwavering mission to provide innovative and comprehensive support to its public school academy students.

SCHOOLS IDENTIFIED AS PARTNERSHIP SCHOOLS

Per the Office of Partnership Districts, partnership agreements are designed to improve achievement levels at the lowest performing schools in Michigan. With multiple partners at the table, districts identify a plan of support and interventions that will improve student outcomes, while prioritizing academic outcomes.

GVSU is an active partner in such collaboration if a GVSU-authorized public school academy is identified for partnership. At the time of this Report's submission, GVSU authorized two public school academies engaged in partnership agreements. Those schools and the details of their agreements are explained below.

Eagle's Nest Academy (Flint, MI)

Duration of Partnership Agreement: 3 years

Background:

Eagle's Nest Academy was identified as a partnership district due to low proficiency scores in Reading and Mathematics as measured by the 2021-2022 MSTEP. The academy had an index score of 22.95 which is .05 below the threshold for identification. Analysis of NWEA data revealed similar results for both subjects with an average of 25% of scholars meeting their growth projections.

On April 17, 2023, Eagle's Nest Academy entered into a Partnership Agreement between MDE, Genessee ISD, the district, and Grand Valley State University. Eagle's Nest Academy was "identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) Year 1 due to an overall building index among the bottom 5% in 2021-2022" and was placed in year 1 of a 3-year cohort. Since April 2023, Eagle's Nest Academy has collaborated with representatives from the MDE, Genessee ISD, Phalen Academies (the school's charter management organization), and GVSU to utilize the partnership agreement resources and support, primarily through MiCIP, to review school performance data, conduct a root-cause analysis, and set concrete goals designed to improve student outcomes and overall school quality.

Additional Context:

Eagle's Nest Academy was granted a 3-year charter contract by GVSU effective July 1, 2023. At that time, GVSU had some confidence that a three-year contract, along with a new CMO, and progress with the resources and support of the Partnership Agreement would facilitate long-term, sustainable improvement indicators within the school organization. While the school has operated with fidelity in the Partnership Agreement, and has received considerable support from the MDE, GVSU, and Genesee ISD since entering into the agreement, the school district experienced a high degree of indicators of distress in its first two years of the partnership. This context has created barriers that the school organization must overcome to be successful in the Partnership process and has been identified for MDE Partnership for another three years following the 2025-2026 academic year. The school has since achieved some degree of stability with a highly effective leader and collaboration with their CMO in the final year of the Partnership Agreement. GVSU is cautiously optimistic that improved stability will lead to improvements through a second cohort of MDE partnership.

Goals and Progress:

The MDE determined in the 18-month benchmark review of Eagle's Nest Academy that it is designated as "off track." Eagle's Nest Academy, if renewed by GVSU, will join the next cohort of Partnership Districts defined by the MDE beginning Spring 2026.

The following goal areas were identified for Eagle's Nest Academy in their partnership agreement:

- 1. **Instructional Capacity:** If the academy focuses on teacher development through job embedded professional learning and allocating resources from the Michigan Grow Your Own Grant and the Teacher and School Leader Grant, then the instructional capacity of classroom educators will improve, so that academic achievement of students will increase.
- 2. **MTSS Academic:** The district needs to allocate resources to develop and implement a Multi-Tiered System of Supports to increase academic growth and proficiency.
- 3. MTSS Affective: If the academy adopts and implements policies that reflect current values and beliefs, then the scholars and staff will have positive relational capacity and practices, that will increase attendance and overall learning and behavior practices.

Westfield Preparatory High School (Redford Charter Twp, MI)

Duration of Partnership Agreement: 3 years

Background:

The Westfield Charter Academy school district opened two campuses in the fall of 2019: Westfield Charter Academy (to serve students in grades K-6), and Westfield Preparatory High School (to serve students in grades 7-12). In December of 2022, the Westfield Charter Academy District was notified by the MDE that they were to enter a Partnership Agreement between MDE, Wayne-RESA, the district, and Grand Valley State University. The Westfield Charter Academy district was "identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) Year 1 due to an overall building index among the bottom 5% in 2021-2022" and was placed in year 1 of a 3-year cohort. The School Index score was calculated to be 23.70 for the 2021-2022 School Year. Throughout the winter and spring of 2023, the

leadership team from Westfield Preparatory High School and their education service provider, National Heritage Academies (NHA), collaborated with representatives from the MDE, Wayne-RESA, and GVSU to review school performance data, conduct a root-cause analysis, and set concrete goals designed to improve student outcomes and overall school quality.

Additional Context:

Student achievement data collected in the spring of 2022 for Westfield Preparatory High School represents 11th-grade students taking the SAT and M-STEP tests (for Science and Social Studies). This testing event was the first year in which Westfield Preparatory High School had 11th-grade students that were required to test given that the building opened in the fall of 2019 and had added grade levels in subsequent years. Additionally, the 2021-2022 school year was the first year coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic and the first year in which participation in state testing was once again required.

Lastly, a major key performance indicator used to calculate the school index for high schools across Michigan is graduation rate. Given that Westfield Preparatory High School did not have 12th grade students as of the 2021-2022 school year, the omission of that heavily-weighted key indicator was excluded from the index calculation and resulted in disproportionate weighting of the other indicators (including student proficiency). The first year the graduation rate was included in the index calculation was for the 2023-2024 school year (and will reflect the graduation rate for the class of 2023). Once the graduation rate was included in the calculation of the index, the school index score increased to 39.13 which was above the threshold for Comprehensive School Improvement designation for that year.

Goals and Progress:

On November 17, 2025, the MDE determined that Westfield Preparatory High School would no longer be identified as a partnership district moving forward.

The following goals were identified for Westfield Preparatory High School's partnership agreement:

- 1. By August 2025, Westfield Preparatory High School will increase daily attendance in order to continue making progress towards charter school contract goals.
- 2. Westfield Preparatory High School will increase student achievement measured by student growth in Math in order to continue making progress towards charter school contract goals.
- 3. Westfield Preparatory High School will increase student achievement measured by student proficiency in ELA in order to continue making progress towards charter school contract goals.

- (1) Not later than December 1 of each year, each university that receives an appropriation in section 236 that, in the current or previous academic year, serves or has served as an authorizing body shall submit a report to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on higher education, the house and senate fiscal agencies, the state budget director, and the department of education containing, at a minimum, all of the following information, as applicable:
 - (a) A list of all of the schools currently authorized, and the following information for each school:
 - (i) The year in which the school was authorized.
 - (ii) The location of each school.
 - (iii) The owner of the property at which each school is located and the physical buildings utilized by the school, as applicable.
 - (b) A list identifying any schools that were closed or lost their authorization in the current or previous academic year.
 - (c) A description of any new contracts for the operation of a public school academy that will operate as the successor to a public school academy that is currently being operated under a contract issued by another authorizing body that is currently performing in the bottom 5% of schools.
 - (d) The academic performance of each school currently authorized, including whether a school is identified by the Department of Education as a partnership school. If a school is identified as a partnership school under this subdivision, the authorizing body shall include a description of corrective actions in the school's partnership agreement, the duration of the partnership agreement, and an assessment of progress toward improvement.
 - (e) The total enrollment of each school at the time of submission, the grades served, and student turnover rate compared to the previous academic year, as applicable.
 - (f) Aggregated student enrollment data for students with an individualized education program as well as the total amount of special education cost reimbursements received by each school during the school's most recently completed fiscal year.
 - (g) The total number of fees, reimbursements, contributions, or charges permitted under section 502(6) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502, that are assigned to each school currently authorized in a single academic year.
 - (h) The names of the members of the board of directors of each school currently authorized and the date that each member of each board was appointed, and a description of the methodology used by the authorizing body to select members for the boards of directors for each school currently authorized by the authorizing body.
 - (i) The name of the applicant who applied and received approval to organize each currently authorized school.
 - (j) The list of contracts and length of their terms, with education service providers associated with each school currently authorized pursuant to section 502 of the revised school code, 1976 16 PA 451, MCL 380.502, as applicable. The contracts described in this subdivision include but are not limited to, those described in section 502(2)(d) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502.

- (k) Activities undertaken by each university to ensure that the board of directors of each school complies with the Open Meetings Act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275, the Freedom of Information Act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246, and laws prohibiting conflicts of interest.
- (I) A description of the activities undertaken by the university to meet the functions of an authorizing body under section 502 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502, as applicable.
- (m) A financial report of the authorizing body's use of fees, reimbursements, contributions, or charges collected or retained under section 502(6) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502. This report must include all of the following, at a minimum:
 - (i) The total amount of fees collected or retained under section 502(6) of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.502, by the authorizing body for the authorizing body's most recent fiscal year.
 - (ii) The amount of funds reports under subparagraph (i) that were spent on compensation for faculty and staff employed primarily to meet the functions of an authorizing body. For the purpose of this subparagraph, an employee is presumed to be primarily employed to meet the functions of an authorizing body if that employee spends more than 50% of the employee's time on those activities.
 - (iii) The number of positions, organized by job title, associated with expenditures reported under subparagraph (ii)
 - (iv) The amount of funds reported under subparagraph (i) that were spent on contractual services to meet the functions of an authorizing body.
 - (v) The amount of funds reported under subparagraph (i) that were spent on other overhead costs to meet the functions of an authorizing body.
 - (vi) The amount of funds reported under subparagraph (i) that were transferred to another operating unit within the university.
 - (vii) The amount of funds reported under subparagraph (i) that were spent on activities other than functioning as an authorizing body, including a list of those activities and the amount associated with each activity.
- (n) An executive summary section that provides relevant summary data for reporting requirements under subdivisions (a) to (m).
- (2) A report submitted under this section must be in a format that meets accessibility standards for viewing on the internet under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Public Law 101-336.
- (3) A report submitted under this section must be published and updated through a link on the homepage of the public university's website.
- (4) In addition to the reporting requirements under this section, each authorizing body that receives an appropriation under section 236 shall adopt a facilities policy ensuring that any structures or other property vacated by a public school academy that ceases operation not contribute to blight in the surrounding neighborhood or community in which the school had previously operated.
- (5) As used in the section, "authorizing body" means that term as defined in section 501 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.501.

Appendix B: MCL 380.502

380.502 Public school academy; organization; operation; bodies authorized to issue contract; application to obtain contract; contents; oversight; suspension of powers; fees; presumption of legality; intergovernmental agreement to issue public school academy contracts.

Sec. 502.

- (1) A public school academy shall be organized and administered under the direction of a board of directors in accordance with this part and with bylaws adopted by the board of directors. A public school academy corporation shall be organized under the nonprofit corporation act, 1982 PA 162, MCL 450.2101 to 450.3192, except that a public school academy corporation is not required to comply with sections 170 to 177 of 1931 PA 327, MCL 450.170 to 450.177. To the extent disqualified under the state or federal constitution, a public school academy shall not be organized by a church or other religious organization and shall not have any organizational or contractual affiliation with or constitute a church or other religious organization.
- (2) Subject to subsection (9), any of the following may act as an authorizing body to issue a contract to organize and operate 1 or more public school academies under this part:
 - (a) The board of a school district. However, the board of a school district shall not issue a contract for a public school academy to operate outside the school district's boundaries, and a public school academy authorized by the board of a school district shall not operate outside that school district's boundaries.
 - (b) An intermediate school board. However, the board of an intermediate school district shall not issue a contract for a public school academy to operate outside the intermediate school district's boundaries, and a public school academy authorized by the board of an intermediate school district shall not operate outside that intermediate school district's boundaries.
 - (c) The board of a community college. However, except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the board of a community college shall not issue a contract for a public school academy to operate in a school district organized as a school district of the first class, a public school academy authorized by the board of a community college shall not operate in a school district organized as a school district of the first class, the board of a community college shall not issue a contract for a public school academy to operate outside the boundaries of the community college district, and a public school academy authorized by the board of a community college shall not operate outside the boundaries of the community college district. The board of a community college also may issue a contract for not more than 1 public school academy to operate on the grounds of an active or closed federal military installation located outside the boundaries of the community college district, or may operate a public school academy itself on the grounds of such a federal military installation, if the federal military installation is not located within the boundaries of any community college district and the community college has previously offered courses on the grounds of the federal military installation for at least 10 years.
 - (d) The governing board of a state public university. However, the combined total number of contracts for public school academies issued by all state public universities shall not exceed 300 through December 31, 2012 and shall not exceed 500 through December 31, 2014. After December 31, 2014, there is no limit on the combined total number of contracts for public school academies that may be issued by all state public universities.

- (e) Two or more of the public agencies described in subdivisions (a) to (d) exercising power, privilege, or authority jointly pursuant to an interlocal agreement under the urban cooperation act of 1967, 1967 (Ex Sess) PA 7, MCL 124.501 to 124.512.
- (3) To obtain a contract to organize and operate 1 or more public school academies, 1 or more persons or an entity may apply to an authorizing body described in subsection (2). The application shall include at least all of the following:
 - (a) Identification of the applicant for the contract.
 - (b) Subject to the resolution adopted by the authorizing body under section 503(5), a list of the proposed members of the board of directors of the public school academy and a description of the qualifications and method for appointment or election of members of the board of directors.
 - (c) The proposed articles of incorporation, which shall include at least all of the following:
 - (i) The name of the proposed public school academy.
 - (ii) The purposes for the public school academy corporation. This language shall provide that the public school academy is incorporated pursuant to this part and that the public school academy corporation is a governmental entity.
 - (iii) The name of the authorizing body.
 - (iv) The proposed time when the articles of incorporation will be effective.
 - (v) Other matters considered expedient to be in the articles of incorporation.
 - (d) A copy of the proposed bylaws of the public school academy.
 - (e) Documentation meeting the application requirements of the authorizing body, including at least all of the following:
 - (i) The governance structure of the public school academy.
 - (ii) A copy of the educational goals of the public school academy and the curricula to be offered and methods of pupil assessment to be used by the public school academy. The educational goals shall include demonstrated improved pupil academic achievement for all groups of pupils. To the extent applicable, the progress of the pupils in the public school academy shall be assessed using both the mathematics and reading portions of the Michigan student test of educational progress (M-STEP) or the Michigan merit examination under section 1279g, as applicable.
 - (iii) The admission policy and criteria to be maintained by the public school academy. The admission policy and criteria shall comply with section 504. This part of the application also shall include a description of how the applicant will provide to the general public adequate notice that a public school academy is being created and adequate information on the admission policy, criteria, and process.
 - (iv) The school calendar and school day schedule.
 - (v) The age or grade range of pupils to be enrolled.
 - (f) Descriptions of staff responsibilities and of the public school academy's governance structure.

- (g) For an application to the board of a school district, an intermediate school board, or board of a community college, identification of the local and intermediate school districts in which the public school academy will be located.
- (h) An agreement that the public school academy will comply with the provisions of this part and, subject to the provisions of this part, with all other state law applicable to public bodies and with federal law applicable to public bodies or school districts.
- (i) A description of and address for the proposed physical plant in which the public school academy will be located. An applicant may request the authorizing body to issue a contract allowing the public school academy board of directors to operate the same configuration of age or grade levels at more than 1 site.
- (4) An authorizing body shall oversee, or shall contract with an intermediate school district, community college, or state public university to oversee, each public school academy operating under a contract issued by the authorizing body. The authorizing body is responsible for overseeing compliance by the board of directors with the contract and all applicable law. This subsection does not relieve any other government entity of its enforcement or supervisory responsibility.
- (5) If the superintendent of public instruction finds that an authorizing body is not engaging in appropriate continuing oversight of 1 or more public school academies operating under a contract issued by the authorizing body, the superintendent of public instruction may suspend the power of the authorizing body to issue new contracts to organize and operate public school academies. A contract issued by the authorizing body during the suspension is void. A contract issued by the authorizing body before the suspension is not affected by the suspension.
- (6) An authorizing body shall not charge a fee, or require reimbursement of expenses, for considering an application for a contract, for issuing a contract, or for providing oversight of a contract for a public school academy in an amount that exceeds a combined total of 3% of the total state school aid received by the public school academy in the school year in which the fees or expenses are charged. An authorizing body may provide other services for a public school academy and charge a fee for those services, but shall not require such an arrangement as a condition to issuing the contract authorizing the public school academy.
- (7) A public school academy shall be presumed to be legally organized if it has exercised the franchises and privileges of a public school academy for at least 2 years.
- (8) An authorizing body may enter into an intergovernmental agreement with another authorizing body to issue public school academy contracts. At a minimum, the agreement shall further the purposes set forth in section 501, describe which authorizing body shall issue the contract, and set forth which authorizing body will be responsible for monitoring compliance by the board of directors of the public school academy with the contract and all applicable law.
- (9) Both of the following apply to the issuance of a contract for a public school academy to be located within a community district:
 - (a) An authorizing body shall not issue a contract to organize and operate a new public school academy to be located in a community district unless, before issuing the contract, the governing board of the authorizing body has certified to the department that the authorizing body has been accredited as an authorizing body by a nationally recognized accreditation body. For an authorizing body described in subsection (2)(e), the authorizing body shall not issue a contract to organize and operate a new public school academy to be located in a community district unless, before issuing the contract, the governing board of each of the public agencies that is party to the interlocal

agreement has certified to the department that the public agency has been accredited as an authorizing body by a nationally recognized accreditation body.

- (b) An authorizing body shall not issue a contract for a new public school academy to be located in a community district if both of the following circumstances exist:
 - (i) Either of the following:
 - (A) The proposed public school academy would operate at the same location as a public school that currently is on the list under section 1280c(1) or 1280g(3), as applicable, of the public schools in this state determined to be among the lowest achieving public schools in this state or has been on the list under section 1280c(1) or 1280g(3), as applicable, during the immediately preceding 3-year period.
 - (B) The proposed public school academy would operate at the same location as a public school academy, urban high school academy, school of excellence, or strict discipline academy that has had its contract revoked or terminated by an authorizing body under the applicable part or section.
 - (ii) The proposed public school academy would have substantially the same board of directors, substantially the same leadership, and substantially the same curriculum offerings as the public school that previously operated at that location.


