TELL ME ABOUT THIS PROGRAM

SHANGHAI, CHINA: With more than 1.3 billion inhabitants and the world's second largest economy, China demands attention. This dynamic country boasts an ancient civilization spanning millennia, yet leads the world in cutting-edge developments. China's most populous city, Shanghai, radiates ineffable elegance, cosmopolitan sophistication, and obsession with the new.

Students may either enroll for the 6-week spring term or opt for an internship. Students taking classes will register for two courses in area studies and/or general education. Courses will be taught by GVSU faculty as well as faculty from the East China Normal University in Shanghai.

A core component of this program is the "on-site teaching and learning" through field trips, which include a trip to Beijing, the capital of China, where we will have a class on the Great Wall and in the Forbidden City, and to Tai Mountain as well as Confucius' home town, Qufu.

FACULTY-LED PROGRAM GRANT: up to \$1,500. All degree-seeking students who apply to their faculty-led program by the priority deadline are automatically considered for a grant of up to \$1,500 from the Padnos International Center. Students must have a current FAFSA on file to be eligible. No application required.
