### Ireland: Social Work

**Open to: Bachelor and Master level students in social work and all majors interested in health care and other social issues in Ireland.**

#### TELL ME ABOUT THIS PROGRAM

Dublin and Galway, Ireland - The journey begins in Dublin, the capital of Ireland. You will experience a brief taste of the city and visit sites like St. Stephen's Green, Grafton Street, Dublin Castle, Christ Church, and Trinity College. The second part of the trip will take you to the west coast port community of Galway, home of the University of Ireland, Galway (UIG). Here, you will become familiar with community life, community social workers, and participate in service learning projects and interactions with clients through the work of the Galway Hospice.

Finally, we will stay in the Burren, in the Irish village of Lisdoonvarna. You will learn about the unique differences between a large city, a small city, and a country village, especially in relationship to the Irish membership in the European Union. Tours and talks with community members will enlighten us about the history of social problems and social interventions.

This program is open to BSW or MSW majors or all majors with permission from the director. Eligible students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for undergraduates or 3.0 for graduates.

## HOW MUCH DOES THE PROGRAM COST?

The approximate fee for this program is Program Fee: \$2,950.

### Includes

- Round-trip transportation from Grand Rapids
- Accommodation
- Most meals (all breakfasts and a few evening meals)
- Field trips
- Local transportation

### Other Expenses

- GVSU Tuition (3 undergraduate credits: \$1,575 OR 3 graduate credits: \$1,881)
- Additional meals (\$350)
- Passport fees (\$140)
- ISIC card (\$28)

**Total Estimated Cost: Total Projected Cost (Program Fee + Other Expenses) = Undergraduate (\$5,043) OR Graduate (\$5,349)**

## GRANTS

**FACULTY-LED PROGRAM GRANT: up to \$1,500.** All degree-seeking students who apply to their faculty-led program by the priority deadline are automatically considered for a grant of up to \$1,500 from the Padnos International Center. Students must have a current FAFSA on file to be eligible. No application required.

**James F. and Virginia L. Goode Global Programs Scholarship:** The purpose of the scholarship is to reduce the financial pressure on students and their families and make a Grand Valley education accessible to students from all backgrounds. This need-based scholarship will ensure that financial need does not become a barrier to intellectual and personal growth for students planning to study abroad.
