Located on two campuses, Getafe and Leganés, UC3M has the largest offering of bilingual studies in Spain. As an Exchange Student, you can select courses from study programs taught in English and in Spanish. UC3M has over 16,000 students, faculty with diverse backgrounds, and excellent educational programs. Students can easily access Madrid city centre through the public transportation system. Students will have access to many student activities including: recreation, cultural activities, social projects, concerts, exhibits, and more. Note: There may be a limited number of exchange placements available for this program.

HOW MUCH DOES THE PROGRAM COST?

GRANTS

STUDY ABROAD SEMESTER GRANT: The average study abroad semester grant award is \$500 per semester. Students who complete an online study abroad application by the designated priority deadline, have a 2.75 GPA and a FAFSA on file, may be eligible for a study abroad grant ranging from \$500-\$1,750/semester. Due to limited funding, not all eligible students will receive a grant.

AUTOMATIC PARTNERSHIP GRANT: \$500

Eligibility criteria applies:

- 2 Grants Available per year
- -Students who are awarded other PIC Funding may not be awarded a Partnership Grant.
